

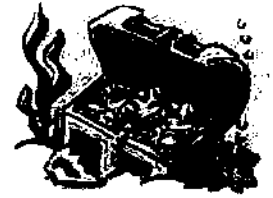

LOCATION: From I-55 take the Richardson Road/Vogel Road exit. Take Vogel Road west (toward Home Depot) Go through 3 stop lights to a 4 way stop sign (about 1.4 miles). Turn left on Old Lemay Ferry Road (this road is crooked and in places steep). Travel a distance of 1.9 miles to a 4 way stop sign. Turn left on Seckman Road travel east about 0.4 miles. Seckman High School is on the right. Park in front of the high school or in front of the grade school
